



# CINCINNATI MUSEUM CENTER PRESENTS THE 2010 FIELD SCHOOL IN ARCHAEOLOGY

Where: Hahn Site, Anderson Township,  
Hamilton County, Ohio

When: July 5-July 30, 2010



While the Hahn Site is one of the best-known Fort Ancient sites in southwest Ohio, little is known about site layout and age. Hahn was first excavated by Peabody Museum at Harvard in 1886. They amassed a collection of

artifacts, but house or village patterns were not identified. Surface collections within the last century indicate that Hahn is a circular to oval village with a vacant central plaza. During the last two Museum field schools at Hahn, we excavated thirteen large units, eight of which straddle a middle period Fort Ancient (ca. A.D. 1300-1500) wall-trench house. At the base of the wall trench (a ditch constructed to support house wall posts), a series of more than two-dozen post molds was exposed and excavated within two separate walls of the house. The remaining units were placed to intercept pit features located by remote sensing. Emphases during the 2010 field school will be directed toward

continued exposure of the wall trench house and features located during remote sensing.

This field school is open to Museum members and the interested public. Ages 11-adult may participate. Ages 11-16 must be accompanied by an adult. Cost per one-week session is \$200 with 10% discount to Museum members..
